→ TRAVELLING TO OLOMOUC

1. By air

There are three main airports in the Czech Republic - Václav Havel Airport in Prague (PRG), Brno -Tuřany Airport (BRQ) and Leoš Janáček Airport Ostrava (OSR). It is also possible to fly to Vienna International Airport (VIE). In any case, you should continue by public transport - train or bus. The information timetables and the latest can be found the web site: on (https://idos.cz/en/vlakyautobusy/spojeni/).

We recommend flying to Prague, taking the Airport Express (tickets can be purchased directly from the driver - CZK 100 by card/cash, every 30 min, duration 40 min) to the Main Railway Station and then continuing to Olomouc by train as the train station is very close to our campus.

Vienna has the best connection to Olomouc by bus. You can use either Flixbus (https://global.flixbus.com/) or RegioJet (https://regiojet.com/) and the journey takes around three hours. These companies also provide buses from Brno to Olomouc.

2. By rail

Olomouc has a great train connection to all the bigger cities. There are direct trains from Prague, Brno and Ostrava. Brno and Ostrava are closer, and the journey can be done within one and a half hours.





Trains from Prague usually take two to three hours. We recommend RegioJet trains or ČD Pendolino trains for the trip from Prague to Olomouc.

3. By road

If you prefer travelling by car, there are motorways A5 and D2 connecting Olomouc and Austria. For travel from Germany, motorways A4 or D1 can be used. Please note that D1 is currently under construction and there is a possibility of traffic jams and delays, so make sure to check the latest situation (https://dopravniinfo.gov.cz/en/D1).

→ ACCOMMODATION

We recommend using our pre-booked hotel due to its strategic location close to our campus and the Main Railway Station. We will use this hotel or MVSO reception area as the meeting point.

Clarion Congress Hotel Olomouc ****

The standard price is € 100/per night during this period of the year.

We managed to get a special bargain - € 82/per night for your stay from the 17th - 21st of June, if you register under these conditions:

- The Travel Agency will provide you with an invoice, which must be paid 60 days before your arrival i.e. until 18th April

There is an option of single-bed rooms (Standard) for € 82/per night x 4 = € 328.





Or you can choose double-bed rooms (Standard) for \leq 97/per night x 4 = \leq 388.

Please be aware there is also an accommodation fee for every night of stay that needs to be paid together with the hotel payment. The fee is CZK 50 for every night ($50 \times 4 = CZK 200 = \text{€ 7,80}$).

The price includes: a buffet breakfast, wi-fi connection and tax. There is a possibility of slight changes in price due to taxes.

In case you cancel your stay after the payment has been processed, the following cancellation fee applies:

Workshop 1.1: The Lump Sum Funding Model in Erasmus - An Advantage or a Trap?

Lump Sum funding was introduced in the Erasmus+ and it has become the dominant funding model for projects in Key Actions 2, 3 and Jean Monnet. The EU introduced the Lump Sum funding model with the





overall objective of simplifying the administration of EU funded projects. By shifting the focus from financial management and checking costs, to the correct project implementation from a substantive point of view, the Commission argued that significant simplification could be achieved. Funding would consequently become more accessible for small organizations and newcomers, contributing to the Commission's objective of making EU funding programmes more inclusive. However, as the current Erasmus+ Programme is over halfway and preparations on the next Multi-annual Financial Framework have started, questions and uncertainties remain with a perceived lack of guidance, or even from legal uncertainty related to the correct management of Lump Sum funded projects. Beneficiaries often feel hesitant to introduce changes to their institutional procedures, or agreements at consortium level, to fully harness the theoretical simplification potential of the lump sum funding model. This workshop intends to outline the main particularities and risks beneath the funding system and to share experiences and good practices among NN partners.

Workshop Description

The mobility of higher education students is a key component of internationalization and global learning. While long-term physical mobility remains a cornerstone of international education, short-term mobilities offer a more flexible and inclusive alternative, ensuring accessibility for students from diverse backgrounds, study fields, and personal circumstances. This workshop will explore the implementation, organization, and evaluation of short-term mobility programs, examining both their benefits and challenges.

Focus Areas

We will specifically address three key aspects of short-term mobilities:





- **Blended Intensive Programs (BIP)** Exploring how these structured short-term mobilities can enhance international learning experiences through a combination of physical and virtual components.
- KA171 Short-term Mobility Understanding the specifics of short-term mobility in the context of international partnerships beyond Europe, including best practices for organization and implementation
- Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) Examining how virtual exchange programs complement short-term physical mobility and foster international collaboration among students and faculty.

Objectives

This workshop aims to:

- -Provide practical insights into the design, organization, and evaluation of short-term mobility programs.
- Share experiences and best practices from different institutions and stakeholders.
- Discuss the impact of short-term mobilities on students, staff, and institutional internationalization strategies.
- Foster collaboration and networking among participants to develop future short-term mobility initiatives.

Expected Outcomes

Participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of the framework and operational aspects of short-term mobilities. Through interactive discussions and case studies, they will have the opportunity to exchange ideas, examples, and strategies for future cooperation in international mobility programs.

This workshop will be highly interactive, encouraging participants to share their experiences, discuss challenges, and explore solutions for making short-term mobilities more effective and impactful.
